

Can You Order **OXYCODONE** 80mg Online? What Patients Should Know

Introduction

Oxycodone is a prescription opioid medication used to manage certain types of moderate to severe pain. Because it can cause sedation, respiratory depression, physical dependence, misuse, and overdose, its prescribing and dispensing are carefully regulated.
